Word Wall Words	In-Text Citation	A reference to the author and page number that is included in an essay; it follows a direct quotation and allows the reader to quickly find the page on which the quote is located
	Direct Quotation	A word-for-word sentence or phrase that is woven into your writing to make your point stronger; credit must be given to the author in the form of an in-text citation so that you avoid plagiarism
	Literary Element	Specific writing techniques that an author uses to make a story more interesting and memorable; examples might include: irony, sarcasm, metaphor, simile, and tone.
