Unit 11 Word Wall Words	Characterization	The process through which the author (or playwright) reveals the personality of a character
	Character Motives	The specific choices that a character makes that helps inform the reader as to what type of person he or she is
	Dialogue	The conversation between two or more characters
	Elizabethan Culture	The 45-year reign of Queen Elizabeth I, a time of political
		stability that witnessed a boom for England in culture, commerce, and literature; this is the time that Shakespeare wrote and thrived
	Globe Theater	Built in 1559, this theater is the central location for almost all of Shakespeare's plays; it was destroyed by fire in 1613 and a second one was built by 1614
	Iambic Pentameter	A poetic line consisting of five iambs, or five sets of unstressed followed by stressed syllables
	Shakespeare	Perhaps the world's best-known poet and playwright, Shakespeare wrote during the 16 <sup>th</sup> and 17 <sup>th</sup> centuries. He is given credit for introducing 1700 words and 300 phrases into the English language. He is the playwright of <i>Romeo and Juliet</i> among 36 other plays and 154 sonnets
	Sonnet	A fourteen-line poem that follows an ABAB/CDCD/EFEF/GG rhyme scheme and mostly deals with themes of love and tragedy
	Theme	A repeated thread or pattern that an author uses to get his or her message across to the reader
	Tragedy	A play dealing with tragic events and ends unhappily with the downfall of the main character
